

Celebrating

20 years of supporting **Aboriginal children** in education

Opening The Doors Foundation (OTDF) will celebrate its twentieth birthday on 4 August! Over the past 20 years the Foundation has supported over 3,000 Aboriginal students in schools around Victoria with over 10,000 grants worth in total more than \$6 million.

To celebrate, the Foundation will be launching a short film profiling some of the families who have been supported by the Foundation and the students' journeys since school. Opening the Doors in 2021

In 2021 the Foundation has supported educational necessities of more than 820 students from more than 200 schools.

How we practice self-determination for our families

As an Aboriginal community organisation, it is essential that OTDF operates at all levels within the principles of self-determination. Over the past few years we have implemented several changes in the grant process, such as moving from cheque to electronic payments, discontinuing the need for parents to provide quotes, developing an online application form, and building further partnerships with schools and Koori educators where this supports families.

During the 2021 grant round the Foundation introduced a direct finance phone number so that families and schools could contact the Finance Officer directly, if required, once their grant had been approved and progressed to the payment stage.

By reducing paperwork and working with community we are now able to receive, approve and pay grants within two weeks. This is not an easy target to meet, especially during the first part of the grant period when we may receive 100 plus applications a day. In support of families in 2021, the Foundation worked with 265 retailers, each with differing protocols for working with the Foundation and families.

As we plan for the 2022 school year, we are taking feedback from families, schools and others who help with the process to ensure that we continue to practice self-determination for our families.

Women's Stories



Women's Stories by Clara Rizzi includes interviews with seven women who have dedicated much of their lives to Aboriginal education. Among these women are OTDF co-founder and Chairperson, Aunty Vicki Clark, and Aunty Elizabeth Pike who was extensively involved with the Foundation in its infancy.
